My wounds are making gratifying progress but my weakness is very great. You must not ~~disturb~~ yourself or to expect often to hear from me in my present situation. By & by I shall attain the strength necessary to be more minute. Every effort is put forth for my comfort. My appetite is very good. I have no fever. Dear wife receive assurances of my deep love to you - also remember me to all the family & express to those friends who have been so kind to you my sincere thanks. When I meet with them they shall have proof of my sense of their kindness. I can say no more now. God bless you all and hasten the day when we may meet together.
